Firstly there was the Xmas event; I am told everyone enjoyed themselves and Santa was sent on his way to make his final arrangements for his labours on Christmas Eve. Unfortunately I was unable to attend due to ill health.

Next came further delays in the completion of the sale of the Fire Station to the Baptist Chapel. On this front I can tell you that the Council is working very hard to satisfy all the questions and observations that the purchaser's legal team keep raising. Just so that everyone was clear, I tabled a motion at the last full Council meeting re-affirming our intention to proceed with the sale and this was passed unanimously. As it stands now, I hope to be able to announce that the sale is complete in the next edition of Halling View.

We have received notification from Medway Council that the Planning Applications for the flats adjacent to the entry to the Cemex site have been refused. I know quite a number of you were concerned over this application and raised objections, as did the Parish Council. At a late stage Cemex and Southern Water entered objections of their own which seem to have been the deciding factor.

The Council set the Precept for the financial year 2018/19 at its full meeting on 12th February and I am please to tell you that the total charge has not changed from last year. In fact, this is the third year that we have pegged the Precept at £51,500. This will represent a reduction of some 6% to each household due to the increased number of dwellings in the village.

Unfortunately, we are experiencing staffing problems at present and consequently the office is not being manned on a regular basis. If you have any real concerns please contact your Ward Parish Councillor. Thanks to Trudi for coming back into the office to do this issue of Halling View.

That's it for now. As I look out of the window it is snowing heavily following a cold night. Drive carefully and keep safe.

FOOTPATH NEWS

The only footpath item of village interest this time is the positive progress – at long, long last – of efforts to get a permissive path between the foot of the Plough Path (RS218) and Whitting's Farm.

All has been ready to go since Halling Parish Council agreed nearly two years ago to pay for the provision and installation (by Tarmac's contractor) of a metal arc-type kissing gate which will open wide enough for more than just pedestrians, and stock-proof fencing to provide a barrier between the path and Tarmac's tenant farmer's field and crops. Halling Parish Council will accept on-going responsibility for maintenance of the metal gate only. Medway Council will install some signage and sturdy poles as barriers to prevent unwanted access by vehicles from the A228 by-pass.

An agreement is to hand to be signed by three parties, Medway Council, Tarmac and Halling Parish Council. A major part of the delay has been due to one of the parties only recently returned from secondment.

What makes this permissive path so desirable is that walkers from Upper and North Halling en route, say, to the Holborough roundabout and Snodland will no longer need to risk their lives by crossing at least once the increasingly dangerous by-pass. Barry Barnes

Grants Criteria

This grant scheme is run by the Halling Association. This is a local partnership of private, public and voluntary organisations that supports projects for the benefit of the parish of Halling.

Who can apply?

• Only groups and organisations based in Halling, or other groups who want to carry out a project in the parish, or to benefit local residents.

How much funding is available?

- Grants of up to a maximum of £250 are available.
- There is a total budget of £1500 available for small projects in one year.

How long do we have to wait to hear the outcome of our application?

• Providing we have all the information we need, you should hear within 6 weeks of submitting the form.

What sort of projects are eligible?

• The Halling Association will be open to helping a wide range of projects, such as events or activities being organised by a group, improvements to a community building, or environmental projects.
